Due to the recruitment of new teams this season, we have formed a Premier and a First Division and although the new season is in its relatively early stage, some significant team and individual performances have already started to emerge. (Details upto date at the time of going to press).

On an individual basis, pride of place must go to Leyton's Reg Harding for a superb 13 and 11 darter against Plumstead giving him an average of 41.75, which I believe is a super league record. One other player, Graham Miller (Kensington) has also recorded an 11 Dart 501. Ray Cornibert follows close behind Reg in the averages, with an individual 37.11 (12 and 15 darts) and also holds the highest recorded game shot, 156, so far this season. A notable performance from a super league newcomer was achieved by Hackney's Dave Foster (16 and 14 darts) for an average of 33.40. West Ham's Tommy Wilson comes next with an individual average of 33.40 (17 and 14 darts). Finally, on behalf of everyone in London, may I extend my congratulations to two Kensington players, Graham Miller and Richard Davies who were the successful qualifiers in the London World Masters play-offs, and to Steve Brown who has also qualified for the World Masters via two routes, the Dutch Open and the North American Open. Our best wishes will travel with them to the England play-offs at the end of October.
