

## London Pride (Darts World report) January 2018

### SENIOR COUNTY

With London sitting in 6<sup>th</sup> place in division one of the BICC a good result was needed against the divisions bottom club when they travelled to Dorset at the end of November, with the first three games going against the visitors it wasn't the ideal start, Lisa Dunford (16.30) played well and will rue missed doubles in her 3-2 defeat, Jane Biggs (13.51) was soundly beaten 3-0 and Lynne Biondini (16.61) lost a very tight game 3-2, London then fought back well with dominant wins for Dee Belcher (18.88), Mandy Solomons (17.89) and lady of the match Leanne Topper (19.99) winning 3-1 to level the score at three apiece.

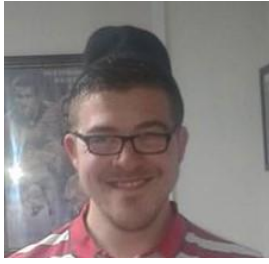

Lee Clifford (26.37) started well and gave London the lead with a nice 3-0 win that was followed by two defeats for Will Blackwell (23.29) and Matt Winzar (22.76) before Shane Wilson (22.64) making only his 2<sup>nd</sup> senior appearance had to use all his guile to gain a hard fought 3-2 win, losses followed for John Hind (22.12) and Chris Holt (23.72) who both lost 3-1 and Paul Killington (19.91) who lost 3-0, Ben Cheeseman (26.05) was involved in a right old tussle and came out a 3-2 winner before a superb display saw Tony Hamit (27.83) dominate for a 3-0 win that saw him share the match award, Jason Gallagher (24.39) was a welcome returnee to the London side but just came up short in his 3-2 loss to Dorsets match award winner Samuel Ward (27.99) in a very entertaining game, Spencer Ellis (19.47) was never in the game in his 3-0 defeat which gave the Dorset Mens B team the overall win although this was reduced to a 7-5 win when Lewis Venes (27.83) put in a clinical performance to win 3-0 that earned him the joint match award with Tony Hamit, Dorset had lost their previous mens B team game 10-2 so this was a fine performance from them but a very poor one for London in many respects and they will have to do much better with some very tough games coming up in the new year, the overall score stood at 10-8 to the hosts.

Steph Stutley (15.87) kept up her unbeaten record for the season with a nice 3-1 win before Tammy Mackenzie (19.76) came up against a rampant Samantha Kirton (26.89) and lost 3-1 despite hitting a lovely 112 finish to win her leg, Samantha was clinical and finished the game with a 116 outshot, Shaz Deboo Costello (19.75) won a tight game 3-2 to also remain unbeaten in the 4 games she's played and also won the match award, Nikki Patten (18.68) was soundly beaten 3-0, Su Holt (17.91) was unlucky to lose 3-2 in a tight match and will rue missed doubles which could have given her a comfortable win, Carly Townsend (15.59) was a recipient of fortune in her 3-2 win that gave the ladies a very credible 3-3 draw against a very good Dorset ladies A side and left the overall score at 13-11 to the home side.

Brazilian star Diogo Portela (26.03) had a comfortable 4-0 win and wasn't tested on the Dorset stage which was followed by three losses for Nick Cocks (23.43) who lost 4-0, Michael Power (26.21) who lost 4-2 but can blame many missed doubles that would have seen him win an easy 4-0 and Tom McGurn (24.66) who was unfortunate to lose a close game 4-3, a returning Tommy Sanwell (25.53) won 4-2 with some of his usual clinical finishing which was followed by Danny Faulkner (24.54) grinding his way to a much needed 4-3 win, Graham Rackstraw was on the wrong end of a 4-3 loss in a very close game that could have gone either way, George Killington (29.39) won the match award with a dominant display winning 4-2, George's victory was to the last one for the visitors as four straight losses followed, Wayne Brown (23.99) fought hard in his 4-3 loss, Lee Cocks (24.25) faced a clinical Scott Mitchell (32.12) who finished the game with a fantastic 121 finish to win 4-1, Steven Ferguson (25.71) also lost 4-1 but played his part in a very good game that saw Mark Porter (25.31) hit a crucial 125 to edge ahead in the game and he never looked back from there although Fergie pushed him all the way, last up David Wawrzewski (21.91) just wasn't himself and capitulated to a 4-0 loss that gave Dorset a 8-4 win and an overall victory of 24-15 including the important 3 bonus points.

London Youth played their 2<sup>nd</sup> match of the season against last season champions Essex and in the under 18's London went down to a 7-0 defeat although London only had 5 under 18's on display, debutant Joshua Murray (17.92) played very well against a very accomplished Jamie Peetoom (21.98) who won 3-1, Joshua can and should take much confidence from a very good debut, Rebecca Holt lost 3-0 after stepping into the breach for the lads, Albie Rackley (20.53) was another player that played very well against another very good youth player in Jakob Kelly (22.16) who won the match award with his 3-1 win, other losses were for Luke Faulkner who is still finding his feet and 8 year old Leo Gaffney who is always an enthusiastic performer, London Youth have a very good ladies under 21 side and they sit top of their section after this 2-1 win over a good Essex ladies side, Rosie Gaffney (14.95) is finally getting back to her winning ways after her 3-1 victory and got the match award for London, Leah Nelson (17.97) played well enough in her 3-1 defeat to Leanne Peetoom (20.89) who hit a nice 103 outshot to win the game and won the match award for Essex, Ex Essex player Ellie Larsson-Brown (12.10) won a close game 3-2 that saw many missed doubles but also a superb 100 finish from Ellie, with Essex now winning 8-2 overall the match win was theirs before the start of the mens under 21's match, it's always competitive between London and Essex in this section, Luke Nelson (23.63) had no answer to Joe Russell (30.67) who won 3-0 in legs of 16, 16 and 17 darts winning the match award for Essex, in the next match Charlie Bubb (18.18) was also up against in when he faced Liam Hill (21.71) who missed a lot of doubles or else he would have finished with a much higher average, Chris Holt (22.77) came back fighting for London with a 3-0 win over Harry Cove (21.00) before Will Blackwell (23.09) lost 3-1 against Chris Gower (24.53), Ben Cheeseman (27.83) got the London match award for his 3-0 win over Bradley Halls (25.90) in a very good game, Essex had won the section 3-2 for a deserved overall victory of 11-4.

### **LADIES SUPERLEAGUE**

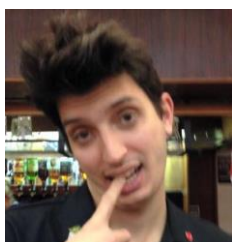
